STM Parish Discernment on Incorporating More Perspectives during Our Weekend Masses

In an attempt to incorporate more voices and perspectives, St. Thomas More Parish leadership is moving ahead with a trial to have qualified lay people – particularly women – offer reflections on the readings for weekend Masses after the opening prayer, before the readings on an occasional basis. The priest would then offer a brief homily at the prescribed time after the gospel. This would be in compliance with Church Regulations on lay preaching (Canon 766). This would be done four times per year during months when there are five Sundays. The parish leadership included in this process were the Pastoral Council, Executive Committee, Worship Commission, and Parish Staff.

The first of these reflections will be given by parishioner Susan Stabile at Masses next weekend (March 30/31). Susan is trained in Ignatian spirituality and has significant experience in giving retreats and other programs of spiritual formation as well as offering individual spiritual direction. She was director of the spirituality center at the University of St. Thomas and was on the ministerial staff of St. Ignatius Retreat House in New York. She designed our small group Ignatian retreats for Advent and Lent this year and last. We are happy to have Susan give our first reflection next weekend!

THURSDAY, APRIL 11, 7-8 PM, CHURCH



Opportunity to Volunteer with Habitat for Humanity

St. Thomas More is considering partnership with Interfaith Builders, a coalition of local faith communities that supports a Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity home building project for two weeks each summer. Each congregation supplies 15-18 volunteers who each work on home construction for at least one day during the two week period; the tentative build dates are June 3-14. No skills or experience required! Volunteers must be 16 or older and all tools and training are provided by on-site build leaders. This is an excellent opportunity to join fellow parishioners and members of our neighboring faith communities in serving a family in need by helping them build safe, affordable housing. Daily work crews include volunteers from participating congregations, often joined by the Habitat family, who must provide “sweat equity” in the build as part of their ownership requirements. Builds are usually in St. Paul; many past builds have been within a few miles of our parish. CRS Rice Bowl - Journey to Sri Lanka and Encounter Christyan

Christyan DhathCroos is from a farming village in Sri Lanka, but spent half of his life in India after he and his family fled during Sri Lanka’s civil war. He was 14 years old when they left and 30 years old when they returned. The family farm was in shambles - fields covered in trees and filled with rocks. Now with a wife and family to provide for, Christyan needed help. CRS is helping Christyan and others like him rebuild their lives. He is growing rice, pumpkin and peanuts and can give his family things he never had. Because his family was always fleeing violence during the war, Christyan never completed school. “I want to make sure my three children are educated,” he says. “That’s my dream. No one in our family has finished their education, but I know my children will.”

His dream is coming true. With the profits from the family’s farm, Christyan can send his 4-year-old son, Godwin, to a private Catholic preschool to help Godwin achieve his dream of becoming a scientist. Christyan isn’t just teaching his family that they can achieve their dreams with the help of a good education - he’s also making sure they understand the importance of helping others. “When we had nothing, CRS came and helped us, and now we have what we need. We should help others too.”

Our youngest students in kindergarten and first grade have been practicing the Examen. To begin, we all met in the auditorium and spread out and found our own quiet, calm place. We practiced quieting our body, hearts, and minds before reflecting on these questions:

1. What was the best part of my day?
2. What is something that could have gone better today?
3. What am I looking forward to tomorrow?
4. What else do you want to tell God?



After a few minutes of reflection, we gathered as a whole and a few students shared their ideas. Then, each child wrote or drew about something that they did that would have made God smile today. This short reflection allowed all of our students to think about their day and have an open conversation with God. On Tuesday in our House Activity, the whole school practiced the Examen as a way to actively practice our Jesuit Identity and be in conversation with God.
